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Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart Symphony No.31 in D Major "Paris"

The Symphony No. 31 in D major, (better known as the Paris Symphony), is one of the most famous symphonies by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart.

The work was composed in 1778 when Mozart was 22 years old. The premiere took place on 12 June 1778. It was Mozart's first symphony to use clarinets.

The work consists of three movements:

- I. Allegro assai
- II. Andantino
- III. Allegro

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, a genius, one of the three great composers in the Classical period among Hayden and Beethoven, was born in Salzburg, Austria. He composed his first piece of music at age five and he wrote his first opera when he was twelve. By the time Wolfgang was 6, he was an excellent pianist and violinist.

Mozart was only 35 when he died. During his short life, he composed in all different musical forms, including operas, symphonies, concertos, masses, and chamber music.



Ludwig van Beethoven

Symphony No.2 in D Major

Op.36

The Symphony No. 2 in D major, Op. 36, was composed between 1801 and 1802. The work is dedicated to Karl Alois, Prince Lichnowsky.

The work was premiered in the Theater an der Wien in Vienna on 5 April 1803, and was conducted by the composer.

This Symphony was written in conventional 4 movements but without a standard minuet; instead, a scherzo took its place, giving the composition even greater scope and energy:

I Adagio molto, Allegro con brio II Larghetto III Scherzo IV Allegro molto

Ludwig van Beethoven was a German composer and the predominant musical figure in the period between the Classical and Romantic eras.

As a German pianist and composer, he is widely considered the greatest of all time, whose innovative compositions combined vocals and instruments, widening the scope of sonata, symphony, concerto and quartet. He is the crucial transitional figure connecting the Classical and Romantic ages of Western music. Beethoven's personal life was marked by a struggle against deafness, and some of his most important works were composed during the last 10 years of his life, when he was quite unable to hear.



Founded in 2019, the Western Sydney Symphony Orchestra (WSSO) is a community Symphony Orchestra serving the communities of Greater Western Sydney.

It is a sub-organisation of the Sydney Contemporary Orchestra Inc. (SCO). Directed by the Artistic Director Dr Brian Chatpo Koo, managed by the Management Committee of SCO, composed of professional musicians of the SCO, the advanced young musicians of the Sydney Hills Youth Orchestra, and trained musicians, the WSSO hosts a series of classical music concerts, providing captivating performances that showcase incredible diversity and skill across a variety of crowd-pleasing classics symphonies.



With these events, the WSSO wishes to build a vibrant, sustainable, and inclusive local community for classical and symphonic music.

Based in Western Sydney, and supported by the Hills Shire Council, the Western Sydney Symphony Orchestra provides valuable development opportunities, and encourages local participation from talented amateur and professional musicians.

#### ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

#### Dr Brian Chatpo Koo



Founding Conductor and Artistic & Executive Director Dr. Brian Chatpo Koo is a Sydney-based musician. Having studied music at the University of Hong Kong and the University of Sydney, Brian was the first person in Australia to receive a Ph.D. degree in music composition. Supported by the Hong Kong University Grant, Brian also studied music at the International Summer Course for New Music in Darmstadt, Germany, and obtained his Licentiate and Fellowship Diplomas from the Trinity College of Music in London.



As a conductor, Dr. Koo has conducted many symphony orchestras and music ensembles to premiere his compositions around the world.

He founded the Western Sydney Symphony Orchestra in 2019 in the hope of enriching the music and cultural life of Western Sydney by providing opportunities for local music lovers to play and enjoy classical music. Through these events, he wants to build a more vibrant, sustainable, and inclusive local community for classical and symphonic music.
